**INCIDENT: Hyde Park Police charge suspect in domestic violence case with new “strangulation” law**

Hyde Park Police have arrested and charged a 20-year-old town resident after investigating a domestic violence incident yesterday morning. One of the charges the suspect is facing is a new NYS strangulation law that went effect on November 11<sup>th</sup> of this year.

Hyde Park Police responded to 4413 Albany Post Road at app. 8:53 AM yesterday, after being contacted by a friend of the female victim involved in the incident; the woman told police she had received a text message from the victim which stated “call the Hyde Park Police and send them to my apartment now”. Officers responded immediately and located both the victim and suspect inside the apartment. The female was escorted from the apartment and told the officers that her boyfriend, by whom she is four months pregnant, had been hitting her throughout the night and would not let her leave. She also stated he had strangled her, and had struck her numerous times with a pillow in the head and ear, causing pain in one ear; she was otherwise not seriously injured.

Twenty-year-old Anthony Delarosa was taken into custody at that location, and was brought to HPPD to be processed. He was arraigned before the Hon. Judge Steinberg and was remanded to the Dutchess County Jail on \$1,500 cash bail / \$2,500 bond.
