A brief history of the project was given and the first phase of the Bellefield Project was explained.

PUBLIC COMMENT:

Herb Sweet, Covey Rd., expressed his concern for the existing businesses on Route 9 being put in such a poor competitive position that they close or move.

John Scileppi, 1 River Rd., spoke in favor of the sewer proposition. He feels that existing businesses will now have the opportunity to have adequate sewerage.

Carol Lally, 7 Point Pl., voiced her support for this agreement and feels that it will help the town to become more successful.

Benjamin Hamblen, 5 Scenic Dr., spoke in favor of the project.

Bridget Barclay, Executive Director of DCWWA, stated that the proposed alternative mitigation plan would be beneficial for the town to move forward.

Tori Kane, Beadart Pl., supports the alternative mitigation plan. She also addressed the problem of the closed stores and explained that community

stores are a thing of the past and feels that this plan is will be a new opportunity.

#### **RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING ATTORNEY TO THE TOWN TO EXECUTE CONSENT JUDGMENT IN *N&N HYDE PARK v. TOWN OF HYDE PARK, et al.***

**WHEREAS**, the Petitioner, N&N Hyde Park, has filed a Petition to review the tax assessment fixed by the Town of Hyde Park for the Assessment Roll of 2016 upon certain real property located in the Town, designated tax number 6065-04-933017-0000 (4174 Albany Post Road); and

**WHEREAS**, the Petition seeks a reduction in the assessment from \$1,200,000 to \$465,000; and

**WHEREAS**, the Attorney to the Town with the assistance and consent of the Town Tax Assessor has negotiated a settlement which provides, in relevant part, for a reduction in the assessment to \$930,000, with a waiver of the Town portion of the tax refund; and

**WHEREAS**, the Attorney to the Town has presented a proposed Consent Judgment which has been approved by the Attorney to the Town and the Tax Assessor and the Town Board has determined that the resolution of this matter, as provided in the Consent Judgment, is in the best interest of the Town of Hyde Park.
